
Overview of Regional and State Dental Hygiene Clinical Examinations

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Regional and state clinical dental hygiene examinations are administered to evaluate the clinical competency of candidates for dental hygiene licensure. Clinical examinations provide a reliable third-party assessment of candidates' clinical skills and are used by state dental boards in making valid licensing decisions.

All exams consist of skill-specific patient treatment in a clinical setting. Additionally, some exams include a written or electronic patient-based component. Clinical licensure exams are administered at various times throughout the year at various host institutions. These clinical exams may be completed on live or simulated patients, depending on location.

This document was created by the American Dental Hygienists' Association (ADHA) to assist candidates for dental hygiene licensure by providing a general overview of regional and state clinical examinations required for licensure for the practice of dental hygiene.

Included in this Dental Hygiene Clinical Examination Summary are the regional testing agencies known as:

- Commission on Dental Competency Assessments (CDCA), Western Regional Examining Board (WREB), and Council
 of Interstate Testing Agencies (CITA) have joined together to form CDCA-WREB-CITA- Administers the ADEX Exam
- Central Regional Dental Testing Service (CRDTS)
- State Resources for Testing and Assessments (SRTA)

Current students must have their program director or designated school representative authorization. Graduate students must provide an official transcript or diploma indicating a dental hygiene AA, AS, or BS degree has been earned or present a current valid US stateissued dental license. Confirmation of Training to Administer Local Anesthesia, if candidate intends to use local anesthetic. Page ADEX SPTCE criteria includes: Calculus detection on four surfaces of four assigned maxillary teeth. Calculus removal is graded upon one mandibular quadrant that is assigned	Candidate must select 6- 10 teeth, including no more than 3 anteriors, with at least 12 surfaces of qualifying subgingival calculus, 6 of which must have at least 1 surface qualify. Of the 12 qualifying surfaces, at least 8 must be on posterior teeth, and of those, at least 3 surfaces must be on molars. No more than 4 surfaces can be on anterior teeth. Computer Component

The CSCE OSCE will be given that includes 100 responses based on a comprehensive intra and extra oral examination. The subject area includes: medical/dental assessment, intra and extra oral assessments and charting, radiology/imaging, dental hygiene care planning, patient care, and dental specialties and pharmacology.	A simulated patient intra/extra oral assessment will be presented via a CRDTS computer tablet. Candidates will have 15 minutes to answer 16 questions.	50 multiple-choice questions on radiology, diseases of the oral cavity and healthy tissue management.
